Boris Karloff and June Foray. First Boris Karloff was born on November 23, 1887 in Camberwell, London, England. Boris Karloff narrated and did the voice of the Grinch. At first Boris wanted to be a farmer when he was in Canada. He didn't like it so he decided to do acting. He did a little bit of silent films. Then one day his director went to talk to him if he wanted to be the monster in the movie Frankenstein. Boris said yes. After the movie Boris became famous. He was in more movies like The Dumb Girl of Portici in 1916, Omar the Tentmaker in 1922, Perils of the Wild in 1925, and Tarzan and the Golden Lion in 1927. The last movie he starred in was Targets in 1968. Boris then died on February 21, 1969 at 82 years old of Pneumonia and Emphysema. He was buried at Guildford, Crematorium, England in the Garden of Remembrance.

The next cast member was June Foray. She was born on September 18, 1917 in Springfield, Massachusetts. She did the voice of Cindy Lou in the movie with Boris Karloff. June Foray's voice was first in public in a local radio drama when she was 12 years old. At 17 years old she moved to Los Angeles and became a popular voice actress on radio. In 1940 she did film work but she did mostly voices for cartoons. She played Lucifer the cat in Cinderella, she did a lot of voices in Woody Woodpecker, she played every girl and Rocky on the show Rocky and Bullwinkle, and as grandmother Fa in Mulan. June Foray is still doing voices of characters in movies and cartoons.

Christmas Cookie Recipe*

WHAT YOU NEED:

Three inch long tear drop cardboard pattern
pretzels
cookie frosting
M&M's
red hots

WHAT YOU DO:

1 Cream the butter and sugar until they are fluffy. Add the lemon zest and eggs. Mix the flour, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg and cardamom and stir into the butter mixture with the almonds. Add enough milk to make the dough malleable; turn out onto a counter and knead until smooth. Chill well. Roll out on a floured counter top. Cut into bars with a knife or a cookie cutter. Place on greased baking sheets and bake at 350 degrees for about 25 minutes, until golden brown. Makes 40 .

INGREDIENTS:

1/2 lb. butter, softened
2 cups brown sugar
Grated rind of 1 lemon
2 eggs
4 cups flour
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tbsp. Cinnamon
1 tsp. nutmeg
1/4 tsp. Cardamom
1/4 cup blanched, slivered almonds
2 to 4 tbsp. milk

2. Break apart the pretzels to make the antlers and then put them together on the top of the head. Next add little dots of frosting. Use M&M for eyes and red hots for Rudolph's nose.

Here are some tips on lighting up your Christmas.

- *Never hang your lights on sharp objects.
- *Unplug the Christmas light bulbs when leaving the house, when retiring for the night, or if the Christmas tree lights are left unattended.
- *Do not puncture the insulation of the holiday light sets with staples or nails.
- *To reduce the risk of fire or electrical shock do not mount or support the Christmas tree lights in a manner that can cut or damage the light sets.
- *Do not close your doors or windows on the Christmas holiday lights or extension cords as this may damage the wire insulation.
- *To reduce the risk of overheating, replace any burned out light bulbs promptly. Use the proper Christmas holiday light bulbs with like volt and wattage replacement light bulbs.
- *Always unplug your Christmas holiday lights before installing or replacing the Christmas light bulbs.
- *Remove the fuses carefully. To avoid the risk of fire replace the blown out fuses with like amp and volt fuses that were provided with the Christmas lights.

Start at the top of the Christmas tree and work your way down. If you are lighting an artificial Christmas tree that is in sections you can stop lighting at the end of each section so you will not have to take the lights off the tree. Just unplug each section after Christmas and store your tree.
